CHC/LAT 200B Problems and Methods in Chicano/Latino Research 4.0 units

Meets once a week, seminar style

This class examines issues of related to conducting research in Latino communities. Topics include problem definition, sampling, quantitative and qualitative methods, participant-observation, language and interviewing, immigration status, gender, participatory research, and communication with the larger community.

Requirements:

All members of the class will be expected to participate actively and regularly in discussion, which means they must be up on the readings for that week. Students will turn in a one page READING NOTES for the week's readings at the beginning of each class that summarizes what the main points of the readings. Late reading notes will not be accepted. Students will also be asked to complete a number of field exercises or PRACTICUMS. These MUST be turned in as well. Grades will be based on both written work and oral contributions.
