Recommended Programs for Chicano Studies/Latin American Studies Majors

As of Fall 2025, there are twenty-seven UCEAP programs with "Latin American Studies" coursework. UCEAP recommends the following seven programs for Chicano Studies and Latin American Studies majors for their suitability for beginner to intermediate Spanish learners. The criteria used to narrow these options includes the following: the programs have course offerings in the subject area in English or Spanish, the programs are located in Latin America, the programs feature Spanish language coursework, and include opportunities for applied learning via internships, research, or community engagement. These programs were selected based on the following qualifications: wide availability and robust course offerings with few restrictions in Latin American Studies for visiting students, well-established curricula within institutional academic structure, and unique learning or practical opportunities for students on and/or offsite.

Field Research in Mexico

Course Offerings (per year) & Restrictions: Four courses for a total of 22.5 quarter/15 semester UC units. Minimum of 6 quarters/4 semesters university-level Spanish at the time of departure. During first 5 weeks in Mexico City, participants take courses in Field Research Methods and Contemporary Mexico, focusing on proposal development, research techniques, and an intensive Spanish review. Over the next 11 weeks, they conduct field research at an established site in Oaxaca, Querétaro, Yucatán, or Mexico City, supervised by a local mentor. Spanish Language Offerings: Instruction is in Spanish; all students must take a Spanish language course:
<u>Advanced Spanish</u> or <u>Spanish Academic Writing for Heritage Speakers</u>. Language level is determined by the results of an on-site placement exam.
