The University of California Irvine's (UCI) Department of Chicano-Latino Studies Committee on Awards in Excellence in Chicano-Latino Studies invites graduating UCI undergraduate students to apply for the following awards:

Outstanding Undergraduate Student Researcher and Promise in Chicano-Latino Studies Award:

Graduating UCI undergraduate students who are majors, minors, or have a departmental certificate in Chicano/Latino Studies, and have successfully completed a distinguished and sustained trajectory of original primary research experience that advances our investigation and understanding of the Chicano-Latino experience within and beyond UCI are eligible to nominate themselves for this award. The research must be conducted under the supervision of a faculty member in the department of Chicano/Latino Studies.

Outstanding Chicano/Latino Community Engagement Award

Graduating undergraduates who have demonstrated exceptional commitment to service that promotes diversity and civic engagement within the UCI student community and/or the broader public are eligible for this award. Evidence of exceptional commitment to the student community and broader public may include (but is not limited to) participation in campus and/or community organizations, developing on-campus programming, engaging in off-campus programming, and volunteer activities that nurture awareness, knowledge, and sustained engagement with Chicano/Latinos at UCI and/or outside of UCI.

Alejandro and Rohde Morales Literary Award

This award was named and established in honor of Alejandro Morales, an acclaimed author of Chicano/Latinx literature who has written novels, short stories and poetry in Spanish and English. The award is intended to recognize the achievements of a graduating 1st generation undergraduate who has submitted a single authored written essay in English or Spanish or a combination of both languages that focuses on the Chicano/Latinx experience and composed in one of the genres listed below. Genres will be rotated yearly. **THE 2022-23 GENRE IS POETRY ESSAY.** Students are encouraged to self-nominate their essay.

Eligibility Criteria:

- 1. Upon applying for the award, undergraduate student applicants should be working to graduate by the Spring 2023 quarter from UCI.**
- 2. Upon applying for the award, undergraduate student applicants must have earned at least a cumulative 3.0 Grade Point Average.**
- 3. Upon applying for the award, undergraduate student applicants must have completed at least one course offered by the department of Chicano-Latino Studies or an exemplary record of academic coursework that is compatible with the goals of these awards.**
- 4. To be fully considered for the award, undergraduate student applicants must complete and submit:**
 - 1. Award in Excellence in Chicano-Latino Studies Application Form**
 - 2. A current and concise curriculum vitae (CV)**
 - 3. A current and complete unofficial copy of grade transcripts**
 - 4. A complete statement that addresses the question asked by the Committee on Awards in Excellence in Chicano-Latino Studies to determine undergraduate student applicant's award eligibility**
